REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF AGILITY JUMPING & GAMES TRIAL JUDGES TRAINING SCHEME

Adopted July 2012

Amended August 2015 October 2015

1. OVERVIEW

- 1.1 Australian National Kennel Council Ltd (ANKC Ltd) Member Bodies will be responsible for the Training, Testing, Assessment and Maintenance of Judging licences.
- 1.2 Agility includes references to the events of Agility, Jumping and Games plus any other events that ANKC Ltd deems to be a part of Agility.
- 1.3 ANKC Ltd Member Bodies may assess Judges in any order for:

Agility Jumping Games

- 1.4 ANKC Ltd Member Bodies may assess Judges for a Games or Agility/Jumping Judges licences independently.
- 1.5 At the discretion of the relevant ANKC Ltd Member Body, aspirants may be required to pass a preliminary theory examination based on ANKC Ltd Member Body Rules and Regulations and general requirements of the Rule Book for the Conduct of Agility Trials.
- 1.6 If an ANKC Ltd Member Body requires a higher standard than the ANKC Ltd Minimum Standards, the ANKC Ltd Member Body's Regulation/s will take precedence over the ANKC Ltd Minimum Standard/s.

2. APPLICATION

2.1 All applications for Agility Judges Courses must be made on the required application form by the date specified by the ANKC Ltd Member Body. All requirements for specific classes must be fulfilled prior to the aspirant undertaking Oral or Written examination and practical assessment. The ANKC Ltd Member Body has the right to seek verification of any information provided by the applicant.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 The Applicant must:
- 3.1.1 Be a member of an ANKC Ltd Member Body for at least 3 years prior to the application and be a current financial member of an ANKC Ltd Member Body.
- 3.1.2 Be over Eighteen (18) years of age
- 3.1.3 Reside in the State or Territory of application for the Licence
- 3.2 Aspirants are expected to attend all lectures and practical training sessions unless otherwise approved by the relevant ANKC Ltd Member Body. Aspirants will also be required to educate themselves by studying the Rules for the Conduct of Agility Trials.
- 3.3 ANKC Ltd Member Bodies may approve applications received from members who do not meet the above criteria providing that they are permanent residents of Australia and can effectively demonstrate and produce documentation verifying their experience and qualifications to meet the above standards gained in a previous country of residence.
- 3.4 Subject to the agreement of both the aspiring Judge and ANKC Ltd Member Bodies, a person may be approved to enrol in an Agility Judges Training Scheme conducted in a more convenient geographic location to that person.
- 3.5 The ANKC Ltd Member Body may recognise prior learning at their discretion.
- 3.6 To be eligible to apply for a licence, the aspirant will:
- 3.6.1 Have personally trained and titled a dog to the minimum of Agility Dog and;
- 3.6.2 Be currently active in the sport of Agility by either:
 - Being a competitor; or
 - · Performing functions of a club official at an Agility trial; or
 - Being or have been an agility / jumping / games instructor.

4. METHOD OF EDUCATION (SELF EDUCATION)

- 4.1 Aspirants will be required to educate themselves by being conversant with the ANKC Ltd Member Body Rules and Regulations relevant to Agility trialling and updates to the Rules for the Conduct of Agility Trials.
- 4.2 Aspirants are to attend all required lectures and practical training sessions unless otherwise approved by the relevant ANKC Ltd Member Body.
- 4.3 Aspirants will also be required to educate themselves by studying the Rules for the Conduct of Agility Trials and current trends and techniques for training in Agility.
- 4.4 The aspirant will arrange for a Trainer/s to observe their judging at the relevant level to assess their performance. A copy of the completed Judges Sheet is to be forwarded to the Course Convener prior to the date set by the ANKC Ltd Member Body.

5. PRACTICAL TRAINING SESSIONS

- 5.1 Mentors and/or Trainers will be appointed by the Judges Training Panel.
- 5.2 Mentors will assist the aspirants by providing guidance, advice and training as agreed between the mentor and aspirant.
- 5.3 The Trainers will:
- 5.3.1 Provide a mentor's function where appropriate;
- 5.3.2 Supervise the aspirant whilst judging appropriate classes.
- 5.3.3 Advise the aspirant of ways in which they feel the aspirant's judging could be improved;
- 5.3.4. Sign the aspiring Judges Practical Training Form after completing details of suggested judging modification or reinforcement of the aspirants judging.
- 5.4 These forms are to be retained by the Aspirant and forwarded to the Course Convener by the set date of the ANKC Ltd Member Body. Copies may be retained by the aspirant.

6. APPLICATION FOR FINAL ASSESSMENT

- 6.1 All Classes:
- 6.1.1 Aspirants will provide documentation of a minimum 2 Practical Judges Training sessions for all classes and events they intend to be assessed for.

7. THEORETICAL EXAMINATION

- 7.1 The pass MARK for this examination is a minimum of 80%.
- 7.2 The marking is to be undertaken as directed by the Training committee.
- 7.3 The theory papers must be clearly marked with any and all incorrect items identified.
- 7.4 The aspirant must pass the theory exam in order to undertake the practical exam.
- 7.5 Where a theoretical test is failed, the aspirant who has failed may make a written request within 14 days of the advice of the results for their test to be reviewed. A different panel of three markers appointed by the Judges Training Panel will, without conferring, separately remark the papers.
- 7.6 All questions with incorrect answers will be supplied to the aspirant with the correct answers.

Any failure in safety considerations is to be regarded as serious.

8. PRACTICAL ASSESSMENT

- 8.1 The aspirant must pass the theoretical exam in order to undertake the practical assessment.
- 8.2 The following are the requirements for a pass in the Practical examination:
- 8.2.1 The aspirant will perform to the satisfaction of the majority of the assessors, all of the duties of a trial judge in the scenario of a formal trial. Aspirants are required to judge a minimum of 3 dogs in each class tested which should consist of a wide variety of skills
- 8.2.2 At the assessors discretion, the aspirant may be asked to judge additional dog/s;
- 8.2.3 At least three assessors must assess each aspirant;
- 8.2.4 Each assessor will individually make a recommendation as to whether the aspirant has passed or failed; and will provide clear indication of the reasons for the failure.
- 8.2.5 A majority of assessors recommendation is required to pass.
- 8.2.6 Assessment sheets will be completed and submitted to the ANKC Ltd Member Body for written notification to the aspirant of their results.

9. RE - ASSESSMENT

9.1 Aspirants who fail the practical assessment may apply for re-assessment. The ANKC Ltd Member Body is not obligated to automatically agree to a re-assessment and each case should be reviewed on its merits. Should a reassessment be granted, this should not be later than 6 months following the original assessment at a mutually agreed time. Consideration should be given to the need for further practical training of the aspirant and the availability of suitable handlers/dogs and facilities.

10. DRESS CODE FOR JUDGING

- 10.1 While Aspirants need not comply strictly with a Dress Code at all their Practical Training Sessions leading up to their examination, they should meet generally acceptable standards (i.e. neat, sensible clothes, appropriate footwear, no open-toed sandals, thongs etc.) when judging at 'non sanctioned trials'. However, the Practical examination is a formal occasion and must be treated in the same manner as a sanctioned Agility Trial. As such, the aspirants must display an appropriate form of dress befitting an official at such an event and they will be marked accordingly.
- 10.2 When judging at high profile events, a judge should liaise with the affiliate as to the appropriate dress for the occasion.

11. FITNESS TO JUDGE

- 11.1 ANKC Ltd Regulations Part 2, Point 1.4 states;
- 11.1.1 All Judges Application Forms, both new and renewal, shall contain the following declaration to be signed by the applicant:

"I declare that I am physically fit and capable of judging in accordance with the Rules and if required I am prepared to undergo a medical fitness test and/or vision test at the discretion of the Member Body of ANKC Ltd. I further accept that my Member Body may at its absolute discretion refuse to grant any renewal of licence and may cancel or suspend for any period or vary in any way any licence already granted or to be granted." 11.2 Should the ANKC Ltd Member Body consider that either the applicant or a licensed judge are unable to meet 11.1.1, the ANKC Ltd Member Body has the right to;

- 11.2.1 Refuse the application;
- 11.2.2 Refuse to grant any renewal of the licence to any person and may cancel or suspend for any period or vary in any way any licence already granted; or 11.2.3 Direct any judge to undergo a medical "Fitness to Judge" examination by a nominated medical office; or
- 11.2.3 Grant in part only an application for renewal of the licence.

12. MAINTENANCE OF SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE

- 12.1 All judges are expected to actively maintain their knowledge and understanding of the Rules and their interpretations as deemed by the ANKC Ltd and the ANKC Ltd Member Body.
- 12.2 In the event that a Judge fails to fulfil this responsibility or fails to follow directions issued by the ANKC Ltd Member Body:
- 12.2.1 The ANKC Ltd Member Body may refuse to grant any renewal of licence or may cancel or suspend for any period or variation in any way, any licence already granted.
- 12.2.2 The ANKC Ltd Member Body may direct any Judge within its jurisdiction to undergo additional training or counselling by the Judges Training Panel.
